

Extension of Stay Form

- a. Depending on your J-1 category, there's a maximum amount of time you can stay in the U.S. as a J-1:
 - i. Short-term Scholar: 6 months
 - ii. Professor and Research Scholars: 5 years
 - iii. Student Intern: 12 months or before your graduation date, whichever is earlier.

ISSS cannot extend your DS-2019 beyond the maximum time limit

 - i. Updated host department offer letter or invitation letter.
 - ii. Proof of extended insurance coverage for J-1 and J-2 dependents
 - iii. Proof of funding for extended period for J-1 and J-2 dependents

Health Insurance

As J Exchange Visitors you are required to maintain health insurance coverage for you and your J-2 dependents throughout your J Exchange Visitor Program. Even if you are currently outside the U.S., if your J-1 or J-2 status is "active", you must have health insurance.
