Key Initiatives to Strengthen the Undergraduate to Graduate Pipeline

- **1 Expanding Partnerships**: Collaborating with the Career Center, Undergraduate Advising, Student Life, and HROE to enhance recruitment practices and broaden access to graduate education.
- **2. Recruitment Best Practices**: Hosting quarterly recruiting group meetings to share strategies, including LinkedIn recruitment and networking opportunities, to better engage prospective graduate students.
- **3. Graduate School Preparation**: Offering workshops such as "Grad School 101" to guide students through the application process, covering topics like personal statements, resumes, funding opportunities, and timelines.
- **4 Support Services for Graduate Students**: Promoting services like Graduate Aggies Professional Development and the Graduate Mentoring Academy to provide mentorship, career development, and networking opportunities. Additionally, working toward offering peer recruitment services that enhance mentorship efforts for prospective students.
- **5 Strengthening the Pipeline**: Fostering a cohesive academic support system across campus partnerships to ensure students are well-prepared and supported in their journey from undergraduate to graduate school.
