





TERMINOLOGY & POLICIES

• Joint v. Individual Lease

• Joint Lease: ALL tenants are responsible for ALL of the rent. If your roommate stops paying, you may have to pay extra to cover the remaining rent.

• <u>Individual Lease</u>: Each renter is only responsible for THEIR PORTION of the rent.

- Lease Term: The length of your lease (12mo/ 9mo/month-to-month)
- Leases are Legally Binding: You typically will not be able to get out of your lease easily or without paying additional fees to end contract early.
- Avoid Scams: If you are not sure if a rental listing is legitimate, reach out to our team and /or "Flag" a listing
- "International Student-Friendly" Filter Option
- **Renter's Insurance:** Some properties may require you to have a policy in place upon move-in. This helps to protect your personal belongings if an incident were to occur.



LANDLORD EXPECTATIONS

• Reasonable Expectations for Your Landlord

- Ensure you have a copy of the lease- read thoroughly before signing
- Properly maintain the unit and complete repairs in a timely fashion
- Notify you (generally 24-48 hours prior) before entering the unit
- Provide notice before increasing rent
- Be accessible for emergencies
- Expect the landlord to pay for regular maintenance
- Expect rent payments on-time and consistently; they can only consider economic hardship with immediate notice

• Unreasonable Expectations for Your Landlord

- Expecting a landlord to assist you with financial problems
- Evicting you without proper notice or violation of the lease
- Allowing you to break your lease
- Not paying rent for any portion of your lease term (i.e. going home for the summer)
- Assuming that you can sublet your apartment
- Fully mitigating roommate conflicts



TENANT RESPONSIBILITIES

• Upkeep of Unit

- Keep the place clean and tidy, free from trash and dirt build-up.
- Your landlord will expect your unit to stay in a clean and habitable state. This includes things such as sweeping, mopping, dusting, and even changing light bulbs and filters.

Limiting Damages

- You are responsible for keeping damages to a minimum.
- While normal wear and tear are generally expected, excessive damage, regardless of if it was caused by you, friends or pets, will need to be dealt with.
- The property is your home, but it's your landlord's property.

Report Issues

- Report any damage or maintenance issues to your landlord immediately. Don't wait for them to discover the issues, especially if the issue is something that is going to get worse over time.
- Prolonged, unreported maintenance issues will become your responsibility if not properly forwarded to the landlord



PLANNING PROCESS

Phase 1

Create a Budget

- Consider living expenses such as rent, utilities, food, etc.
- Consider the amenities that you want and the area you want to live in.
- What is most important to you?

Phase 2

Narrow Your Search

- Begin your search using AggieSearch.
- Gather your top choices & create a spreadsheet.
 - This will help you compare price, amenities, location and more.
 - *If you are not able to travel before move in, you can ask most properties to do a virtual tour.

Phase 3

Ask Before Signing

- Is renter's insurance required?
- How do I pay rent?
- What are my initial move-In costs?
- What are my lease terms?
- What utilities are included & how do I pay them?
- What is the parking situation?
- What is the pet policy?
- What is the guest policy?


